BIS is principally an academic school; we expect students to move from our school either to other international schools, or to further education. As we evaluate prospective students for admission, we will consider the possibility of meeting their specific needs within our educational environment. It's important to note that BIS primarily functions as an academic

As an IB World School, we offer main programmes of the International Baccalaureate: The Primary Years Programme (PYP) and the Middle Years Programme (MYP years 1-4) at our campus. 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Connections to other IB Policies

Admissions and Language at BIS, we recognize the importance of a solid foundation in a student's mother tongue for academic success. As part of the admissions process, we assess a student's language profile based on their previous academic performance. It is essential that applicants demonstrate age appropriate literacy and proficiency in a language. To facilitate effective communication and integration into our academic programs, all previous school records must be translated into English for evaluation purposes. For students entering BIS in the either on PYP or MYP 1 year, proficiency in Academic English is crucial for engaging with course materials and successfully sitting the MYP examinations. Therefore, language proficiency assessments are conducted as part of the admissions process specifically for MYP1 applicants. If a student is deemed incapable of accessing information and expressing themselves at an appropriate level, their admission to BIS may be reconsidered. Once admitted, students will be required to complete a comprehensive Language Profile questionnaire for all languages offered at BIS. This information will assist in determining the appropriate language group placement. Within two weeks of enrollment, language teachers will assign newly admitted students to the language group that aligns best with their proficiency level. 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Acceptance Criteria

All students are still required to follow the admissions process completely to be considered for admissions. A decision for acceptance is only made after the appropriate members of staff evaluate the above information in accordance with our Inclusion Policy and Language Policy. Our evaluation process takes into account various factors such as academic performance, aptitude, and readiness to handle the rigor of specific MYP subjects. While we strive to accommodate students' preferences, it is essential to ensure that they have a realistic chance of achieving success in their chosen subjects. By considering multiple factors, we aim to provide guidance that maximizes students' potential and sets them up for a fulfilling academic experience. Siblings are prioritized for all grade levels, however students applying from other IB Schools are given priority when applying.
